

Guide on how to claim your work experience completed in ENGN3200 Engineering Internship towards ENGN3100 Practical Experience

Purpose

The guide provides ANU Bachelor of Engineering students with information on what action they need to undertake, if they intend to use the work experience hours accumulated in ENGN3200 Engineering Internship to satisfy their ENGN3100 requirements.

Background

The Bachelor of Engineering (BE) degree at the ANU is accredited by the Engineers Australia. A requirement of Engineers Australia, as part of the degree accreditation, is that ALL BE students MUST complete the equivalent of 12 weeks of full-time (420 hours) work experience outside the University during their studies. At least 8 weeks (280 hours) must be within an engineering environment, supervised by an accredited engineer. The other 4 weeks (140 hours) may be in any general type of work (e.g. casual employment in retail, hospitality, general office administration etc.). This is implemented in the BE degree at the ANU as the ENGN3100 Practical Experience course.

Until the end of 2019, the BE students who completed ENGN3200 were automatically marked as having met requirements for ENGN3100. The earlier process was introduced during the period when all ENGN3200 Engineering Internship students undertook 420 hours work and met the requirements for ENGN3100 Practical Experience. Students are no longer required to complete 420 hours for ENGN3200 Engineering Internship.

In order to ensure that the University records how our BE students meet their work experience requirements accurately and to reflect the changes in the minimum work hours required for ENGN3100, CECS Associate Dean (Education) and Associate Directors (Education) recommended that those BE students who completed ENGN3200 are now required to enrol in and submit a report for ENGN3100 to evidence they have met the requirements as set by Engineers Australia. As a result of this recommendation, the new processes outlined below are introduced in 2020.

How to use this Guide

This Guide is for those students who undertook or will undertake ENGN3200 from 2020.

If you completed your ENGN3200 **before or by Summer session 2020 (December 2019 to February 2020)**, you **do not** need to follow this Guide, but contact CECS Student Employability team student.employability.cecs@anu.edu.au for advice.

Depending on how many hours of Engineering work you have completed in your ENGN3200 Engineering Internship, what you need to action for ENGN3100 will vary.

Please read through this Guide and select the total hours you completed/will complete for ENGN3200 to understand what action you need to undertake for ENGN3100 Practical Experience.

Note: Although ENGN3200 templates will be accepted in lieu of ENGN3100 supporting documents as outlined in the table below, if your total work experience hours counting towards ENGN3200 is less than 420 hours, you are required to account for other work experience that brings total hours of work experience to 420 hours. In this case you must use ENGN3100 supporting documents for the remaining hours of your experience. Confidentiality Agreement

Your employer may request to have a Confidentiality Agreement signed to protect their confidential information and Intellectual Property. When you discuss this matter with your Host Supervisor, please inform your plan of using your experience there to satisfy the requirements of two separate courses ENGN3200 and ENGN3100 at the ANU. As the report and other materials submitted will be examined by both ENGN3200 Convenor and ENGN3100 Convenor, you may need to include both convenors in the Confidentiality Agreement. In the first instance, please discuss this with your ENGN3200 Convenor.
