Important - your personal Information

There are some points you may wish to consider in the information you include in your Resume regarding your personal and private information. The following are items students should consider amending in their Resume or EOI to limit privacy risks, but also present a more professional Resume:

 Photograph: in Australia photographs are generally not expected to be included in Resumes and as a result their inclusion may make a Resume appear less professional.
 We would recommend that photographs should be removed from Resumes. If you would like for a potential employer to see your photo you can include a link to your LinkedIn account.

CRICOS Provider: 00120C

- **Date of birth:** date of birth is not required for Australian resumes. Your age should not be considered relevant to an employment decision. As a result, and to protect your personal information, you should remove your date of birth from your Resume.
- **University ID:** While the risk of privacy breaches may be low from sharing your university ID with others, it may still pose a risk to your privacy. Your university ID is meaningless to an outside organisation and as such does not need to be included in your Resume or Expression of Interest.
- **Uni email:** If you include your university email in your Resume please be aware that this will be providing people with access to your uni ID. It would be advisable to use a personal email instead (you can always set it up to redirect to your ANU email). Please ensure that the email you use is professional (i.e. your name or variant of your name).
